Meeting Overview

The July 3rd in-season salmon teleconference provided key updates on salmon counts, fishery openings, permit data, and subsistence fishing conditions. The meeting included representatives from AITRC, ADFG, NPS, as well as community members and fishers.

Key Updates

- 1. Salmon Counts and Fishery Openings ADFG Glennallen Office (Tracy Hansen)
 - Cumulative sonar count at Miles Lake: 600,000 salmon
 - **July 3 count:** 4,000 fish
 - **Personal Use Fishery:** Extended by 24 hours (now 132 total)
 - Subsistence Fishery: Open through September 30
 - Sport Fishery Restrictions:
 - o One king salmon per year
 - o Catch-and-release for kings begins July 7
 - No bait or treble hooks allowed
- 2. Permit and Staffing Updates Wrangell St. Elias (Amber Cohen)
 - Permits Issued:
 - o 212 Chitina Subdistrict (above average)

o 271 Glennallen Subdistrict (near average)

• Fish Wheels Registered:

- 41 at Copper Center Visitor Center
- o 8 at Slana

• Staff Announcements:

- o Dave Sarafin retired
- o Patrick Lewis becomes the new Wrangell St. Elias team lead

3. Subsistence User Reports

• Chistochina Area:

- Saturday, caught 30 fish and two kings
- Sunday slowed down
- Water levels are high, affecting fishing
- o Report of seeing the Suslota fish go through
- o Batzulnetas fish should be showing up shortly

• Chitina Area:

- Sporadic catches
- Ongoing repairs to fish wheels

Discussion Points

• Voluntary King Salmon Conservation:

- o Encouragement to release kings safely to support declining stocks
- Trespassing on Alaska Native Corporation (ANC) Lands:
 - Subsistence users reminded to avoid trespassing
 - o Report violations to wildlife troopers and say something to the trespassers

• Community Relations:

o Call for good neighborliness and cooperation among fishers
